

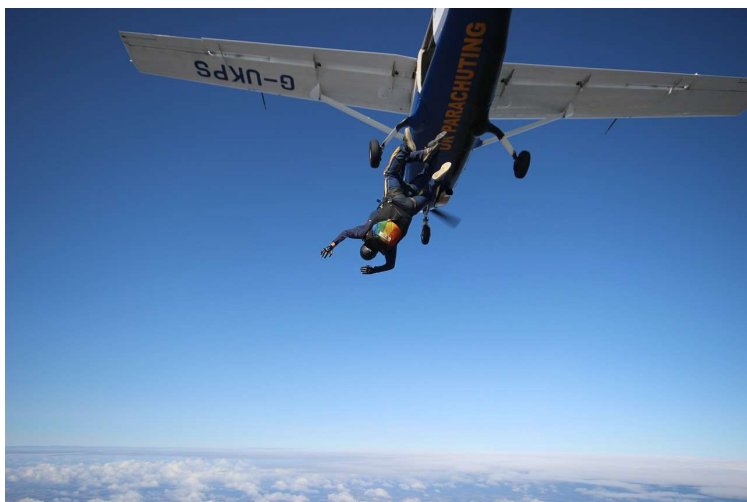

JUST A SHORT TIME AGO



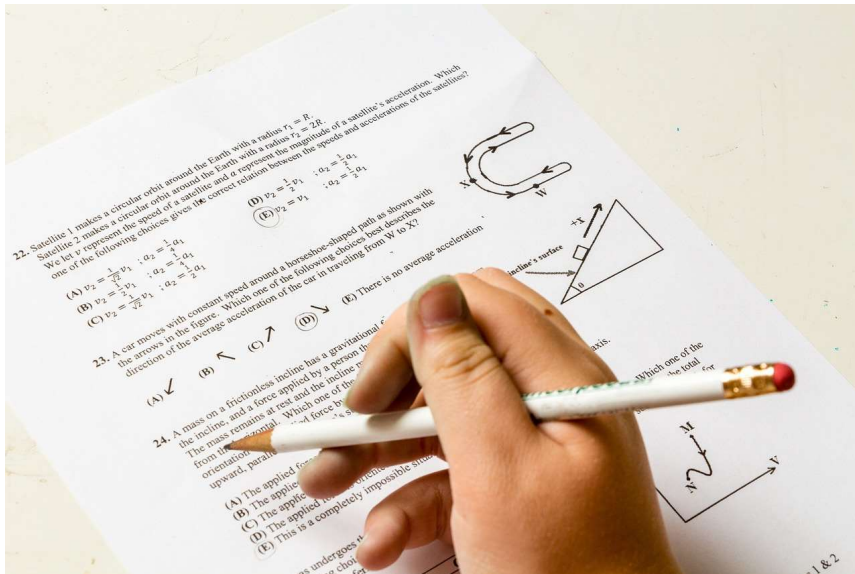
He has **just** jumped
off a plane.

ALREADY EARLIER THAN THE TIME EXPECTED



A: I'll lay the table
B: No need, thanks. I
have **already** done it.

YET – UNTIL NOW



Has he finished **yet**?
He hasn't finished **yet**.

RULES

We use **just** and **already** in positive sentences.

Position: **between have and the past participle.**

The film has just started.

The film has already started.

We use **yet** in negative sentences and questions.

Position: **It comes at the end of the sentence.**

Have you done it yet?

I haven't done it yet.
