- I told you to contribute a few ideas but not **so few**.

SUCH + SINGULAR NOUN

- Don't be such a fool. You know I'm joking.
- This is such an entertaining book!

SUCH + PLURAL NOUN

- They are such lovely people. I love hanging out with them.

SUCH + UNCOUNTABLE

- There is such excellent wine in that region. Hard to say no.
